

WHEREAS, Such moving pictures tend to undermine and destroy the moral fiber of our citizens, both young and old; and

WHEREAS, The Maryland State Board of Censors has failed to prevent the exhibition of such moving pictures; now therefore be it

*Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland,* That we do hereby condemn the exhibition of all indecent, vicious and salacious moving pictures which tend to undermine and destroy the moral character of the people of this State; and be it further

*Resolved,* That the Maryland State Board of Censors be and it is hereby requested to prohibit the exhibition in the State of Maryland of all moving pictures having a plot, tone or character which is degrading, indecent or salacious and which tend to glorify vice and marital infidelity and to make light of all high ideals; and be it further

*Resolved,* That notice is hereby given to said Board that if it cannot or will not prohibit the exhibition of such moving pictures, that this Assembly will pass legislation at its next session which will prohibit the exhibition of all such moving pictures in this State.

A Joint Resolution requesting the State Roads Commission and such other person or persons as the Governor may appoint to investigate the practicability of bridges across the Lower Potomac and Choptank Rivers.
