Passed Mar. 2, Resolution granting access and use of the Library to the 1841.

Officers of the two Houses.

Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the officers of each house shall have as free access to, and use of the State Library during the session, as the members of the Legislature have.

## No. 14.

Passed Mar. 2, Resolution authorising the Commissioner of Loans to borrow One Hundred and Fifty Thousand Dollars, for twelve months, on a pledge of so much of the Bank Stock of the State as may be necessary to pay the interest on the Public Debt on the first of April.

Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the Commissioner of Loans be, and he is hereby authorised, under the direction of the Treasurer of the Western Shore, to borrow, for twelve months, on a pledge of so much of the bank stock of the State as may be necessary, one hundred and fifty thousand dollars, at a rate of interest not exceeding six per centum, to pay the interest on the public debt due the first day of April next.
