Resolution in relation to the House Printer.

Passed March
10, 1845.

Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland, That His Excellency the Governor, be authorised to settle with the printers of this House, for such reports, &c., as have been ordered to be printed by the House and not yet received, and that the chief clerk be directed to forward the same by mail, together with the balance of the journal of proceedings, to the members of the Legislature, the postage of the same to be paid by the Treasurer of the State.

Resolution in favor of William McNeir.

Passed March
10, 1845.

Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the Treasurer pay to William McNeir, the sum of two hundred and thirty-three dollars and eighty-eight cents, for printing executed by order of the Senate, during the present session.

No. 57.

Resolution in favor of the Morgan Riflemen and the Potomac Riflemen.

Passed March
10, 1845.

Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the Adjutant General of this State be, and he is hereby authorised to furnish Capt. Peter L. Huyett, of the Morgan Riflemen, and Capt. James M. Magruder, of the Potomac Riflemen, with fifty knapsacks each, by giving satisfactory security for the safe keeping and return, provided, they are in the armory.
