SEC. 2. *And be it enacted*, That any person or persons violating the provisions of this act, shall be liable to a penalty of not less than five dollars, nor more than ten dollars, to be recovered before any justice of the peace in Baltimore county; one half of said penalty thus to be imposed by said justice, shall be for the use of the informer, and the other half for the use of the school fund in Baltimore county.

Passed Jan 1, 1847.

Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the Treasurers of the Western Shore be, and he is hereby authorized to pay to the members of the General Assembly, and the several officers thereof, at or within ten days after the adjournment of the session next due to the Legislature, and for which they shall be entitled, the several salaries of the members of the General Assembly, of the several Officers of the same.
