

CHAP. 3. in said county, from the fifteenth day of November eighteen hundred and forty-six, to the fifteenth day of November eighteen hundred and forty-seven.

How to make payment to teachers. **SEC. 2.** *And be it enacted,* That such payments shall be made to the teachers of each election district of said county, according to the apportionment of the school fund prescribed by an act passed at December session eighteen hundred and forty-six, chapter one hundred and seventy-eight.

In cases of fraudulent accounts. **SEC. 3.** *And be it enacted,* That if any account presented, shall appear to the said orphans court, to be false or fraudulent, the said orphans court is hereby authorized to investigate the same, by summoning and examining witnesses under oath, and to adjudge the admission or exclusion of such accounts.

CHAPTER 2.

Passed Dec. 30, 1847. *An act for the relief of Joseph R. Savage of the City of Baltimore.*

May have benefit of insolvent acts *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland,* That the commissioners of insolvent debtors for the city and county of Baltimore be, and they are hereby authorized and directed, to hear, consider and determine the application of Joseph R. Savage, for the benefit of the insolvent laws of this State, in the same manner as if he had not applied for the benefit of the insolvent laws within the last two years.
