

SEC. 2. *And be it enacted*, That the said James I. Chew shall, in every instance, before he proceeds to collect under and by virtue of this act, make affidavit before some justice of the peace in said county, that the same remains unpaid; and that he hath not, directly or indirectly, individually received any security or satisfaction for the same, or any part thereof, more than the credits that may be allowed thereon.

SEC. 3. *And be it enacted*, That this act shall continue and remain in force until the first day of January, one thousand eight hundred and fifty-one, and no longer.

CHAPTER 7.

An act to allow John T. Veirs further time to complete his collections.

Passed Jan. 16
1850.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland*, That John T. Veirs, late collector of State and county tax for the third election district of Montgomery county, be and he is hereby authorised and empowered to collect any taxes or balances of taxes now remaining due to and uncollected by him in the district aforesaid, in the same manner and with the same power and privileges as are allowed by the existing laws, in such cases made and provided.

SEC. 2. *And be it enacted*, That the said John T. Veirs shall, in every instance, before he shall proceed to the aforesaid collection, make affidavit before some justice of the peace for Montgomery county, that the same remains unpaid, and that he has not received any security or satisfaction for the same, or any part thereof, more than the credit allowed thereon.

SEC. 3. *And be it enacted*, That this act shall not continue in force longer than the first day of January, eighteen hundred and fifty-two.
