

LAWS OF MARYLAND.

MARYLAND, Sc.

At a Session of the General Assembly of Maryland, begun and held at the City of Annapolis, on the first Monday of December, being the 7th day of the said month, in the year of our Lord 1818, and ending on the 19th of February, in the year of our Lord 1819,

THE FOLLOWING LAWS WERE ENACTED, TO WIT:

CHAPTER 1.

An act to settle and ascertain the Salary of the Members of the Council for the ensuing year. Passed Dec 14.

Sec. 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, That* each member of the council shall be entitled to receive, for the ensuing year, the sum of five hundred and thirty four dollars current money, for his salary. Salary ascertained

CHAPTER 2.

An act to alter and change the place of holding the Elections in the fifth election district in Anne-Arundel County. Passed Dec. 15

Sec. 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, That* the judges of the fifth election district in Anne-Arundel county, be and they are hereby authorised and directed, to hold in future the elections in said district at and in the house of Henry Whalen, on the Frederick-Town turnpike road, any law, usage or custom, to the contrary notwithstanding. Place changed for holding elections in 5th district.

CHAPTER 3.

An act for the benefit of Matthew Murray, late Sheriff of Baltimore County. Passed Dec 16.

Sec. 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, That* the judges of Baltimore city court be, and they are hereby authorised, to ascertain and liquidate the claim of Matthew Murray, late sheriff of Baltimore county, to the first day of October last, for supporting insolvent debtors confined in the gaol of said county, City Court authorised to liquidate claim of M. Murray.
