

At a SESSION of the GENERAL ASSEMBLY of MARYLAND, begun and held at the City of ANNAPOLIS, on Monday the second of April, in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and ninety-two, and ended the sixth of the same month, the following LAWS were enacted:

C H A P. I.

A Supplement to the act, entitled, An act to establish a bank in Baltimore-town. Passed April 6.

BE it enacted, by the General Assembly of Maryland, That if any person or persons shall steal, or take by robbery, any of the notes of the said bank, it shall be deemed and construed to be felony, of the same nature and in the same degree as if the offender had stolen, or taken by robbery, any other goods of like value with the money due on such bank note, and such offender shall suffer such punishment as he should or might have done if he had stolen, or taken by robbery, other goods of the like value with the money due on such bank note. Stealing of notes deemed felony, &c.

C H A P. II.

An ACT to authorise the justices of Dorchester county to assess and levy a sum of money on the inhabitants of said county for the purpose therein mentioned. Passed April 6.

WHEREAS it is represented to this general assembly, that the court-house in the town of Cambridge, in Dorchester county, stands in need of considerable repairs and alterations, and it is prayed that the justices of Dorchester county be empowered and directed to levy a sufficient sum of money for the purpose aforesaid; Preamble.

II. Be it enacted, by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the justices of the peace of Dorchester county shall, and they are hereby empowered and directed, to assess and levy, at the request of the justices of Dorchester county court, and at such time or times as the said court shall require, on the assessable property of Dorchester county aforesaid, any sum of current money, not exceeding three hundred pounds, to be applied, by the justices of Dorchester county court, to the making such repairs, alterations and improvements, in the said court-house, as to them shall seem necessary for the convenience of the said court, their officers, and other persons attending the said court. Justices to levy money, &c.

C H A P. III.

An ACT continuing in force certain acts and resolutions of the general assembly for the time therein mentioned. Passed April 6.

BE it enacted, by the General Assembly of Maryland, That all acts and resolutions of the general assembly, which would otherwise expire or cease to have effect after the end of this present session, shall be and they are hereby continued, and shall be in force until the end of the next session of the general assembly.
