Chesapeake and Ohio Canal Company, and the certain ruin which must ensue in the event that this legislature shall adjourn without a further appropriation to it, we respectfully propose to your honorable body, the appointment of another committee of conference from the two branches of the legislature, to ascertain if possible, whether any acceptable plan of appropriation to that work can be devised.

Which was read.

On the question being put,

Will the house assent to the said message?

Determined in the negative.

The clerk of the senate returned the resolutions relating to the Bank of Maryland, &c.

Endorsed, "dissented from."

The resolution in favor of Robert Malone.

And the resolution, directing the librarian to furnish the register of Wills of Washington county, with the index of the laws, from 1825 to 1831.
