

On motion of Mr. Tuck,

Ordered, That when this house adjourns, it shall stand adjourned sine die.

On motion of Mr. Hooper,

The house took up for consideration the bill from the senate entitled an act to authorise Henry P. Norris to have recorded the name of a certain negro, brought into this state.

The said bill was then read the second time, passed, and sent to the senate.

On motion of Mr. Zeigler,

The house took up for consideration the bill reported by him, entitled an act to alter and change the divisional lines between election districts No. 3 and 9, in Washington county;

The said bill was then read the second time, passed, and sent to the Senate.

On motion of Mr. Sprigg, of Allegany,

Ordered, That he have leave to withdraw from the files of this house, the memorial and accompanying papers of Bene S. Pigman and others.

On motion of Mr. Hooper,

Ordered, That he have leave to withdraw from the files of the house, the memorial of sundry citizens of Somerset county, praying for a change in a county road in said county.

The clerk of the senate returned the bill, entitled an act to alter and change the divisional line between election districts No. 3 and 9, of Washington county, endorsed "will pass," and ordered to be engrossed.

Also the resolution nominating John Van Lear as state's agent, endorsed "assented to," and the resolution ordered to be engrossed.

Messrs.
