Ordered, That Messrs. Gallagher, Graves and Le Grand, report the same.

Mr. Martin obtained leave to bring in a bill, to be entitled a supplement to an act passed at December session eighteen hundred and thirty-nine, chapter one hundred and forty-six;

Ordered, That Messrs. Martin, Lowe and Willis, report the same.

On motion of Mr. Gaither,

Ordered, That he have leave to withdraw from the files of the house the petition of Giles Easton, a revolutionary soldier, praying to be placed on the pension roll.

On motion of Mr. Orrell,

The house adjourned until to-morrow morning 9 o'clock.
