

CORRECTION

The latter portion of an order submitted by Mr. Williams of Baltimore city, commencing on page 476 having been omitted, we have inserted it in full for the purpose of making the corrections. Mr. Williams of Baltimore city, submitted the following order: Ordered, That the order of precedence in the House shall on this day be as follows:

1. All messages and petitions shall be laid without notice to the House, on the clerk's table, and shall not be taken on the floor, and shall be referred to the committee of the next General Assembly.

2. No laws to bring in bills or motions to introduce resolutions shall be granted, without the unanimous consent of the members present.

3. Reports from all committees shall be received and placed at the bottom of the calendar of bills, &c., in the order in which they are presented, except revenue reports.

4. After all reports are presented, the several committees shall be and heard, to be discharged from the further consideration of all subjects not reported on by them respectively.

5. This resolution and reports shall be called in the following order:

1st. Revenue bills, resolutions and reports received from the committee on Ways and Means.

2nd. Special orders of the day, according to their dates, as such.

3rd. All other bills, resolutions, reports and orders lying on the clerk's table in the order of time in which they were introduced, or received in the Senate.

6. There shall be no debate on any bill, resolution, report or order of amendment, should a member first make an enquiry, another answer, and another answer, containing himself strictly to an explanation.

7. All legislative action of the House shall cease at 3 o'clock P. M., except on bills, resolutions and amendments received from the Senate. And bills, &c., not recorded on the calendar shall be and heard, and referred to the consideration of the next General Assembly.

8. When this House adjourns, it shall stand adjourned to 9 o'clock in order to read and receive messages to and from the Senate and the Governor, and to close the session.
