In accordance with Article II, Section 17, of the Maryland Constitution, I have today vetoed House Bill 1157.

This bill provides for the awarding of grants-in-aid to students who are enrolled in various institutions of higher learning in "educational programs related to the teaching profession\*\*\*."

The Attorney General has advised me that the title of House Bill 1157 is defective and thereby renders the bill unconstitutional. For the reasons given in the attached copy of the Attorney General's opinion, which is to be considered a part of this message, I believe that this measure must be vetoed.
