(House Joint Resolution 118)

House Joint Resolution requesting the Mayor of the City of Baltimore to study the State's Attorney's Office in Baltimore with regard to positions, salaries and equalization of comparable professional tasks and submitting the recommendations of the study to the Board of Estimates for appropriate action.

WHEREAS, The prosecution of crime in a highly populated urban area is an extremely difficult task calling for the most exceptionally qualified talent; and

WHEREAS, To attract and retain highly qualified and skilled persons in the State's Attorney's Office, it is necessary to pay a comparable salary to persons in positions of equal difficulty and responsibility; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, That the Mayor of Baltimore initiate a study of the duties and responsibilities of the State's Attorney and his deputy State's Attorneys in an effort to determine a fair reasonable salary for these individuals which would take into account the salaries of individuals with comparable professional tasks; and be it further
