Annapolis, Maryland, July 30, 1973.

State of Maryland, to Wit:

This being the day described by Section 16 of Article II, and by Section 14 of Article III of the Constitution for the Special and Extraordinary meeting of the General Assembly of Maryland at 11:00 o'clock A.M.:

On the motion of Delegate Becker of Montgomery County, seconded by Delegate Kircher of Baltimore City, the name of Delegate Dorman of Prince George's County was placed in nomination for Speaker pro tem. Nominations were closed by motion; said motion prevailed.

Delegate Dorman was elected unanimously by roll call vote.

The Chief Clerk appointed Delegate Donovan and Delegate Pesci to escort the Speaker pro tem to the rostrum.

The Speaker pro tem was sworn in by James P. Mause, Chief Clerk, under House Rule No. 86.
