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By virtue of a warrant of survey bearing date the 4th day of May 1674 granted by the Hon^{ble} Charles & Miles W. John Hinson of Kent County gent. directed to the surveyor of this Province or his Deputy. bearing purport of a former grant unto the said Hinson and M. Joseph Wickes of the same County gent. bearing date the Twentieth of May 1674. To Survey three several tracts of Land in the said County lying on the Eastern Neck containing one thousand four hundred Acres of Land according to its ancient bounds. and the same to Divide into two Equal parts between the said Hinson and the said Wickes

These may humbly Certifie that I Edward Sweatnam sworn hereto by the hon^{ble} Council for the Survey of the said Province to Survey and Divide the said three several tracts as aforesaid have laid out for the said John Hinson the twelfth day of June 1680 A Tract of Land called Hinsons Division, formerly the market place and Elk Neck lying on the East side of Chesapeake bay in Kent County in the River beginning at a bounded Locust tree standing at the Landing place of the plantation of the said John Hinson neare a pointe of Marsh and running from the said Locust tree by a Line Drawne along the Eastern bay side west and by south fifty five perches, and from the west end by south Line End by a Line drawne south west fifty perches to a marked white Elm tree standing on the side of a high Cliff and from the said White Elm tree by a Line drawne south south west two hundred and fifty perches along the said Eastern bay side to a Logg sticking in the marsh neare the said bay side, and from the said Logg by a Line drawne south south east fiftene perches thence from the end of the south south east line by a direct Line drawne to a bounded great white oak tree standing on the edge of the wood by the said Marsh side, and from the said great white oak by a Line drawne East half a point southerly, being the Line of Division between the said John Hinson and the said Joseph Wickes thence the water of a Creek running out of Chesapeake River called Long Neck Creek, then running on the north side of the said Long neck Creek till it meetes a Line Drawne south south west from a bounded Locust tree standing on a point called Elk pointe being the mouth of a Creek called south Creek three hundred and Eighty perches, then from the said Locust tree standing at the said Elk Pointe by a Line drawne west end by south one hundred and Ninety perches to a bounded Locust Logg sticking in an Island of small Persimmon bushes in a Marsh leading to the Narrows, and from the bounded Locust logg at the end of the west end by south line by a Line drawne south south west two hundred and five perches and from the end of the south south west line by a Line drawne North west two hundred two perches along a small Creek first called John Hinsons Calf pasture Creek to the first bounded Locust tree, Bounded on the west by the said Eastern bay, on the south by the East end half a point southerly line, on the east by Chesapeake River, and on the North by the last west end by south line and the aforesaid Calf pasture Creek containing and Now laid out for Eight hundred fifty five Acres more or less.
