 manumission Inrolled in the County Records. Also I give unto my  
 son William Ford one Negro Girl called Dark untill she arrives to the  
 age of Eighteen years when she is free as above. Also I give unto my  
 son Joseph Ford one Negro Girl called Mell until she arrives at the  
 age of Eighteen years when she is free by her manumission. Also I  
 give unto my Daughter Sarah the wife of Aaron Hill one Negro Girl  
 called Hannah that she Sarah hath now in possession to have her Heirs  
 forever. also I give unto my Daughter Sarah six silver Teaspoons  
 and silver tongs. Item I give unto my Niece Rachel Ford (the Daughter  
 of my Brother John Ford) one bed and furniture which bed she lies  
 on now, to her and her Heirs forever. My Will and desire is <sup>that</sup> after my just  
 Debts <sup>& funeral charges</sup> are paid and the above Legacy taken out of my Estate the  
 remaining part of my Estate to be equally divided amongst my Children  
 Viz. Moses, William, Joseph, Robert & Sarah, share & share alike.  
 And I do hereby nominate and appoint my son Moses Ford my only & Sole  
 Executor of this my Last Will and Testament, Utterly revoking & Cancelling  
 all other Will or Wills heretofore made or done by me Ratifying and  
 Confirming this and no other to be my last Will and Testament as Witness  
 my hand Seal the day & year above Written.
