OF THE
MARYLAND INEBRIATE ASYLUM,
FOR THE YEAR 1864.

To His Excellency,

A. W. BRADFORD, *Governor of Maryland:*

Dear Sir:—In compliance with the charter of the Maryland Inebriate Asylum, and as ordered by the Board of Directors, the following report of the Board for the year 1864 is presented:

The Institution is yet without buildings for the use and accommodation of applicants and others who are subjects of its interest. The Board of Directors, however, continue to hold their meetings, and to attend to whatever business that requires their consideration. All the applications that are made for the exercise of the reformatory purposes of the charter have not been complied with, because the applicants were not willing to be placed in a Lunatic Asylum. A few, however, have availed of this arrangement, and are now undergoing the treatment necessary for their recovery.

It is ardently hoped that the Board will be enabled at no distant day, to carry out the provisions of the charter in buildings which may be the property of the Institution. This is the principal consideration of the Board at the present time, and will be accomplished at the earliest moment, that the means may be afforded.
