Which was read, assented to, and sent to the House of Delegates.

The Clerk of the House of Delegates delivered the following message:

BY THE HOUSE OF DELEGATES,

January 5th, 1865.

Gentlemen of the Senate:

We have received your message, informing us of the organization of your Honorable Body. The House of Delegates has been organized by the election of Hon. John M. Frazier, as Speaker, and the appointment of William R. Cole, Esq., as Chief Clerk.

We are now ready to proceed with the business of the session, and concur with your Honorable Body in the appointment of a joint Committee to wait upon his Excellency, the Governor, and receive any communication he may be pleased to make.

We have appointed Messrs. Poteet, Lee, and Smith, of Dorchester, on the part of this House.
