RESOLVED BY THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY OF MARYLAND, As recommended by the Judicial Compensation Commission, beginning July 1, 1987, judicial salaries, including any increases in salary which result from a general salary increase for State employees, under Section 1-703(b) of the Courts and Judicial Proceedings Article, shall be as follows:
