

1993 LAWS OF MARYLAND

MARYLAND, Sct.:

At a Session of the General Assembly of Maryland, begun and held in the City of Annapolis on the Thirteenth Day of January, 1993, and Ending on the Twelfth Day of April, 1993, William Donald Schaefer, being Governor of the State, the following laws were enacted, to wit:

CHAPTER 1

(Senate Bill 204)

AN ACT concerning

Higher Education – State Aid to Nonpublic Institutions – Joseph A. Sellinger Program

FOR the purpose of naming the program of State aid to nonpublic institutions of higher education the Joseph A. Sellinger Program.

BY repealing and reenacting, with amendments,

Article – Education

Section 17-101

Annotated Code of Maryland

(1989 Replacement Volume and 1992 Supplement)

Preamble

WHEREAS, This man, known to many thousands of Marylanders simply as "Father Joe," has lived with grace, good humor, joy and love, has touched the lives of countless men and women with his devotion to learning, has exemplified the life of teaching,
