To have and to hold all and singular the said goods, Negro Woman, Household stuff and furniture, and other the premises above bargained & sold, or mentioned and intended to be, to the said Hiram W. Woolford his Executors, Administrators and Assigns, forever: And I, the said Jerome Richardson, for myself, my heirs, Executors and Administrators, all & singular the said goods, Household stuff, Negro Woman and furniture, and Horn & Carriage and other the premises unto the said Hiram W. Woolford, his Executors,
