

(c) Notwithstanding the provisions of subsections (a) and (b) of this section and § 19-114(d)(2)(ii) of this part, a continuing care retirement community that qualifies for an exemption from a certificate of need under § 19-114(d)(2)(ii) of this part may not admit a subscriber directly into a comprehensive care nursing bed if the direct admission would cause the occupancy of the comprehensive care nursing beds in the continuing care community to exceed 95 percent of full capacity.

CHAPTER 58

(House Bill 328)

AN ACT concerning

Calvert County - County Officials - Salaries

FOR the purpose of altering the salaries of the County Commissioners of Calvert County, Calvert County Treasurer, Sheriff of Calvert County, and Orphans' Court Judges for Calvert County; providing that this Act does not apply to the salary or compensation of the incumbent County Commissioners of Calvert County, Calvert County Treasurer, Sheriff of Calvert County, or Orphans' Court Judges for Calvert County; and generally relating to the salaries of certain Calvert County officials.
