RESOLVED, That State and local governments will use the month of November to assess the ways to improve understanding, cooperation, and communication with American Indians, especially those residing within Maryland's borders; and be it further

RESOLVED, That a copy of this Resolution be forwarded by the Department of Legislative Services to the Honorable Parris N. Glendening, Governor of Maryland; the Honorable Thomas V. Mike Miller, Jr., President of the Senate of Maryland; and the Honorable Casper R. Taylor, Jr., Speaker of the House of Delegates.

A Senate Joint Resolution concerning

Judicial Compensation Commission Report

FOR the purpose of ~~proposing an alteration to~~ providing for the compensation of the members of the Judiciary in this State, pursuant to Section 1-708 of the Courts and Judicial Proceedings Article of the Annotated Code of Maryland.

WHEREAS, Section 1-708(b)(2) of the Courts and Judicial Proceedings Article of the Annotated Code of Maryland establishes a 7-member Judicial Compensation Commission appointed by the Governor with 2 members appointed on nomination of the President of the Senate, 2 members appointed on nomination of the Speaker of the House of Delegates, 1 member appointed on nomination of the Maryland State Bar Association, and 2 members appointed at large. The Judicial Compensation Commission is constituted as follows: appointments made on the nomination of the President of the Senate: John Paterakis and Elizabeth Buck; appointments made on the nomination of the Speaker of the House of Delegates: Laurence Levitan and Charles R. Jenkins, Sr.; appointment made on the nomination of the Maryland Bar
