

CERTIFICATIONS

For the purpose of making the Clerks of the Circuit Courts subject to and governed in accordance with the rules of the Court of Appeals pursuant to another provision; repealing certain visitorial and rulemaking powers; repealing the authority of the Clerks to appoint deputies; repealing a special provision as to Washington County; making the Deputy Clerks and other employees of the offices of the Clerks appointed and removed according to procedures set by law; directing that the Judicial Department's budget be certified to the governor; generally relating to the Courts, clerks and employees of the Courts, and to the Judicial Department; and submitting this amendment to the qualified voters of the State of Maryland for their adoption or rejection.

And it is hereby certified that at said election, 584,554 votes were cast for the adoption of said Chapter 62 and 206,033 votes were cast against the adoption of said Chapter 62, the said Chapter 62 of the Acts of 1990 has therefore been ratified.

STATE ADMINISTRATIVE BOARD OF ELECTION LAWS ANNAPOLIS, MARYLAND

Pursuant to the provisions of Section 23-11 of Article 33 of the Annotated Code of Maryland, the State Administrative Board of Election Laws does hereby certify that at the General Election held in the State of Maryland on November 6, 1990, an Act known as Chapter 261 of the Acts of 1990 was submitted to the voters of the State of Maryland under the provisions of Article XIV of the Constitution of the State of Maryland, said Act being as follows:

AN ACT concerning

Maryland Constitutional Convention – Sense of the Voters

For the purpose of taking, at the general election to be held in 1990, the sense of the voters of this State in regard to calling a convention for altering the Constitution or for framing a new one pursuant to Article XIV, Section 2 of the Constitution of Maryland; and submitting this amendment to the qualified voters of the State of Maryland for their adoption or rejection.

And it is hereby certified that at said election, 321,412 votes were cast for the adoption of said Chapter 261 and 470,477 votes were cast against the adoption of said Chapter 261, the said Chapter 261 of the Acts of 1990 has therefore failed ratification.
