MARYLAND, To wit:

At a session of the General Assembly of the State of Maryland, begun and held at the city of Annapolis, on the last Monday in December, being the 26th day of the month, in the year one thousand, eight hundred and thirty six, there appeared in the Senate Chamber the following Senators elect for the Western Shore—Elias Brown, Levi Hilliary, Richard Thomas and William Schley, Esquires; and the following Senators elect for the Eastern Shore—William T. Goldsborough, Edward N. Hambleton, William U. Purnell, James B. Ricaud, and Thomas Wright, (of Tho's) Esquires, who severally qualified in the presence of each other by taking the oaths required by the Constitution and the Laws, and by declaring their belief in the Christian Religion, and took their seats.
