Ought to recover but because it is not known what damages the afo^d William hath sustained by occasion
of the non performance of the promise and assumption aforesaid therefore it is commanded the Sheriff of somerset
County by the oath of honest and Lawfull men of his baileynch he diligently Enquire what damages
the same William has sustained as well by occasion of the non performance of the promise & assumption
aforesaid as for his costs and charges by him about his suit in that part apposed and the Inquisition which —
thereupon he should take to the Justices of his Lordships County Court of somerset to be held at Dividing
 Creek the third tuesday of May next under his seal and the seals of those by whose oath he should make
that same Inquisition he send together with the writt thereof to him directed &c and the same day is
given to the same William there &c. — At which day before the Justices of his Lordships County Court
of somerset at Dividing Creek (under the afo^d William Gunn by his attorney aforesaid) and the Sheriff sends not less of the
writt therefore as before it is commanded the Sheriff that by the oath of honest and Lawfull men of his baileynch
he should diligently Enquire inform aforesaid & the Inquisition which shall be to the Justices of his Lordships County
Court of somerset to be held at Dividing Creek the third tuesday of March and One thousand seven
hundred and Ninety three under his seal & and the seals &c he send together with the writt thereof to him directed
& and the same day is given to the afo^d William there &c.

At which said third tuesday of march to wit the nineteenth day of the same month and Anno Domini One
thousand Seven hundred and Ninety three came against the said William Gunn by his attorney aforesaid and the
Sheriff to wit Joshua Goldwell Gentle returned a certain Inquisition Indented & taken before him
at Winkerton in the County aforesaid the 19th day of March and One thousand Seven
hundred and Ninety three by the oath of honest and Lawfull men by which it appears that the
afo^d William Gunn hath not sustained any damages by occasion of the non performance of the promise
and assumption aforesaid Whereupon the said William Gunn by his attorney aforesaid pray the Court here that for
as much as it doth appear by the Inquisition aforesaid that the Jurors did not assess any damages for the afo^d
William which according to the tenor of the writt aforesaid they ought, — that the same Inquisition may
be altogether held for naught and that a new writt to the Sheriff of the County aforesaid may issue & which is by
the Court to him granted &c Thereupon as before it is commanded the Sheriff that by the oath of honest
and Lawfull men of his baileynch he should diligently Enquire inform aforesaid & the Inquisition
which shall be to the Justices of his Lordships County Court of somerset to be held at Dividing Creek the
third tuesday of June next under his seal & and the seals &c he send together with the writt thereof to
him directed &c and the same day is given to the afo^d William there &c.

All which said third tuesday of June to wit the eighteenth day of the same month and Anno Domini One thousand Seven
hundred and Ninety four came against the said William Gunn by his attorney aforesaid and the Sheriff to wit Joshua —
