

# THE CONVENTION BILL.

A BILL entitled, An Act to provide for the taking the sense of the people upon the call of a Convention to frame a new Constitution and form of government for this State, to provide for the election of Delegates to said Convention and the assembling thereof.

Section 1. Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, That on the first Wednesday of April next, at the same places where the polls are by law held in the several counties and the city of Baltimore for the election of delegates to the General Assembly, every person entitled to vote for delegates to the General Assembly shall vote upon the question of the call of a Convention to frame a new Constitution and form of government, by expressing in writing or in printed form, on the same ballot he may cast for delegates to said convention, the words, "for a Convention" or "against a Convention," as the case may be, and in case there should be any ballots cast without the designation hereinbefore prescribed, the same shall not be counted either for or against a Convention, but a separate return shall be made of the same by the judges of election as aforesaid; and that at the same election the legal voters of this
