attempts to elect members and illegally in the election of
members in Somerset county on the fourth day of November
at a contempt of law, and in violation of the provision of
the constitution that the said election is void, and that the speaker of
the House take the necessary steps to the election of four representa-
tives against county in the House of Delegates.
