or no use to your petitioner who humbly prays your worshipps will be pleased to take it into your Consideration and
set him tax free and your petitioner shall ever pray.

The petition aforesaid being Read and heard and fully understood It is Considered by the Justices here that the afo
negro man of the abovesaid John Gunby be for the future tax free as by the petition aforesaid is paid &c.
