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U. S. SANITARY COMMISSION is a volunteer, and unpaid bureau of the War Department. It is in perfect subordination to the administration of the Government, and is therefore co-operative with it. It does not supersede, nor supplant the authorities of the Government; but is subservient to them in their attentions to the wants of the soldier, especially when Government means may not be at hand, or when, what may be needed for the soldier, is not provided by the Government. The wants of soldiers therefore will always be supplied if made known to Surgeons, or Agents.
