

Whereof \$111 13 were carried, as already stated, to the credit of the State's Tobacco Warehouses in Baltimore—having been received from part of the premises, and before the States Wharves in Baltimore were made a distinct source of revenue by the appointment of a State's Wharfinger—\$12,548 12 were, as any other unappropriated revenue of the State, disbursed in the several years in which it was received—and \$235 20 (being the amount received in 1837) was, (as will be the future revenue from that source) placed to the credit of the sinking fund, to provide for the redemption of the said debt of \$30,000, in pursuance of ch. 350 of 1835, and will be found so set forth in Exhibit No. 7. accompanying the Treasurer's Annual Report to the present General Assembly.

The Treasurer understands these receipts to have been derived from the wharves and premises appertaining to the State's Tobacco Warehouses in Baltimore, but he is not sure that they all are. The State's Wharfinger reports them to be derived from Dugan's, Frederick street, Pratt street, and Light street wharves.
