conceive to repeat a paragraph extracted from  
the Philadelphia Gazette and Daily Advertiser,  
(Dec. 18, 1860)—is follows:  
"This astonishing production was discovered  
about 12 months ago in Paris by the present

phical gentlemen. In this city we are informed it
