The house adjourns until to-morrow morning 9 o'clock.

WEDNESDAY, January 14, 1818.

The house met. Present the same members as on yesterday. The proceedings of yesterday were read. The bill to establish a bank and incorporate a company under the name of The Bank of Dorchester, was sent to the senate.

Mr. W. R. Stewart from the committee delivers the following report:

The committee to whom was referred the petition of sundry inhabitants of Queen Anne's county, for and against the repeal of the law of last session authorising commissioners to straighten and amend the public road from Church Hill to Sudler's Cross Roads, beg leave to report, that they have had the same under consideration, and are of opinion that the provisions of the act of assembly, entitled, An act to empower and authorise the several county courts of this state to direct the opening, straightening, or shutting up, of public roads, are sufficient for the good government of the same, and that the petitioners are respectfully referred to such tribunal.

Which was read.

The house proceeded to the second reading of the bill, entitled, An act annulling the marriage of Mary Henry and Charles Henry, of Frederick county; and on motion by Mr. Hawkins, the bill was recommitted to the committee who reported the bill.

Mr. Downey delivers a petition from Catharine Freshour of Frederick Town, praying for a divorce which was read and referred to Messrs. Downey, Hawkins and Buckey.

Mr. Claude delivers petitions from Mary Larmer and William Lilly, of the city of Annapolis, praying that the levy court of Anne Arundel county may be authorised to levy a sum of money for their support which were severally read and referred to Messrs. Claude, R. Dorsey and Stephen. Also a petition from the official members of the Methodist Episcopal Church in the city of Annapolis, praying legislative aid to enable them to finish and complete a house of worship lately erected in said city; which was read and referred to Messrs. Claude, Stephen and W. R. Stewart.

Mr. Wilson delivers a memorial from Robert Lloyd Tilghman, Tench Tilghman, and William H. Tilghman, of Talbot county, executors of James Earle, praying that the operation of a resolution requiring the executors of James Earle to complete the records in the office of the late general court for the eastern shore, and in the office of the court of appeals, may be suspended; which was read and referred to the committee of grievances and courts of justice.

Mr. R. Dorsey delivers a petition from Thomas and Nicholas Worthington, counter to the petition of William James Turner; which was read and referred to the committee appointed on the petition to which it is counter.

On motion by Mr. R. Dorsey, Ordered, That the said committee be enlarged by the addition of Messrs. R. Dorsey and Harrison.

The house proceeded to the second reading of the report on the petition of Elizabeth Beall, widow of Lloyd Beall, and on motion by Mr. Forrest, the further consideration thereof was postponed until Tuesday next.

The bill authorising a lottery to raise a sum of money for the purpose of building a Masonic Hall at Church Hill in Queen Anne's county, was read the second time, passed and sent to the senate.

The clerk of the senate delivers the bill, entitled, A further additional supplement to the act, entitled, An act to regulate elections; the bill relating to Dark Lane in the city of Baltimore, and the bill to enable Robert Gorsuch to complete his collections in Baltimore county, severally endorsed, will pass. Ordered to be engrossed. A bill, entitled, An additional supplement to the act, entitled, An act to establish a bank and incorporate a company under the name of The Bank of Caroline, endorsed, passed by the senate January 14, 1818; which was read. Also the bill, entitled, An act supplementary to an act for amending and reducing into system the laws and regulations concerning last wills and testaments, the duties of executors, administrators and guardians, and the rights of orphans and other representatives of deceased persons, accompanied by the following message:
