

On motion by Mr. Forrest, Leave given to bring in a bill, entitled, An act for the revaluation of real and personal property in Montgomery county. Ordered, That Messrs. Forrest, Gaitber and Washington, prepare and bring in the same.

On motion by Mr. Brooke, Leave given to bring in a bill, entitled, An act to repeal an act to regulate the manner of granting licenses to retailers of spirituous liquors, and to prevent persons from dealing with free negroes after sunset in Kent county, passed at December session 1818. Ordered, That Messrs. Brooke, E. Browne and Spencer, prepare and bring in the same.

Mr. Blakistone presents a petition from Catharine Brewer, of Saint Mary's county, praying for support; which was read and referred to Messrs. Blakistone, Dorsey and Millard.

Mr. Wm. Price presents a petition from Richard R. Tasker, of Allegany county, a revolutionary soldier; which was read and referred to the committee on pensions and revolutionary claims.

Mr. Ross delivers a bill, entitled, An act to incorporate the Reformed and Evangelical Lutheran church in the county of Frederick, called "St. Mary's Church," and to supply a defect in a deed made to the same; and a bill, entitled, A supplement to the act, entitled, An act to appoint trustees for the sale of the property therein mentioned, being part of the real estate of the late Henry Willis deceased; and Mr. Millard delivers a bill, entitled, An act authorising and empowering the levy court of Saint Mary's county to assess and levy a sum of money for the support and maintenance of Ann Tippet, of said county; which were severally read.

On motion by Mr. Washington, Leave given to bring in a bill, entitled, An act supplementary to an act, entitled, An act for the speedy recovery of small debts out of court. Ordered, That Messrs. Washington, Ross, Willis, Dorsey and Maulsby, prepare and bring in the same.

Mr. Orrick presents a petition from John Catherwood, of Baltimore county, a revolutionary soldier; which was read and referred to the committee on pensions and revolutionary claims.

Mr. Schnebly delivers a bill, entitled, An act annulling the marriage of John Frenner, and Mary his wife, of Washington county; which was read.

Mr. Garner presents a petition from Charles Sewell, a revolutionary soldier; which was read and referred to the committee on pensions and revolutionary claims.

Mr. Kennedy presents a petition from David Harry, Jr. of Washington county, praying a special act of insolvency; which was read and referred to Messrs. Kennedy, Schnebly and Gabby.

Mr. William R. Stuart delivers a bill, entitled, An act for the relief of Nelly Seegar of Queen-Anne's county; and Mr. Quinton delivers a bill, entitled, An act to repeal certain acts therein mentioned; which was read.

Mr. Stevens presents a petition from Thomas S. Loveday, of Talbot county, praying that he may be paid by the treasurer of the school fund for the tuition of sundry poor children; which was read and referred to Messrs. Stevens, Hayward and D. Martin.

On motion by Mr. Dennis, Leave given to bring in a bill, entitled, An act to authorise William A. Palmore to import and bring into this state the negro slaves therein mentioned. Ordered, That Messrs. Dennis, Dashiell and King, prepare and bring in the same.

Mr. Jenifer delivers a bill, entitled, An act for the benefit of Mary Franklin of Charles county; which was read.

Mr. Blakistone delivers a bill, entitled, An act authorising and empowering the levy court of Saint Mary's county to assess and levy a sum of money for the support and maintenance of Catharine Brewer of said county; which was read the first and second time, passed, and sent to the senate.
