Cecil County Labourer is detained in Our Goal of Ann Arundel County  
 under Sentence of Death for a certain Felony by him committed whereof he  
 was convicted the 27th Day of April 1739 before the Honourable Henry Hooper  
 and John Lawson Esq. Justices of Oyer and Terminer and Goal Delivery for the  
 said County of Cecil as appears by the Record there of transmitted to our Provincial  
 Court, And Whereas for divers Causes and Considerations the Recourse moving  
 We have thought fit to suppress the Execution of the said Sentence We therefore  
 command you that from the Execution of that Sentence or any other Sentence  
 of Death pronounced against the said William Turner you altogether  
 cease and forbear until our further Pleasure shall be known therein  
 provided that the said William Turner transport himself or cause himself  
 to be transported out of this our Province within Ten Day from the Date  
 hereof otherwise this our Reprieve shall be and is hereby declared to be void  
 and of no Effect anything herein contained to the contrary notwithstanding  
 Witness Our trusty and Well beloved Samuel Ogle Esq. Governor of our  
 said Province this tenth Day of June in the 25th Year of our Dominion  
 Anno Domini 1739
