shall be allowed the Sum of Sixty-four Pounds of Tobacco, for every Day he shall necessarily attend in consequence of such Appointments, in the next County Levy; and every Inspector who shall meet and attend the Justices aforesaid at the Court-House, shall be allowed Thirty-two Pounds of Tobacco per Day, in the next County Levy, for his Attendance.

What is to be done with old Inspected Tobacco.

CL. **And whereas** it is represented to this General Assembly, that there are in divers Warehouses in this Province, several Hogsheds of old Tobacco remaining in the Way of the Inspectors, and have been lying there for many Years past, and no Owners appear to claim the same: To remedy which Inconvenience for the future, **Be it Enacted**, That the Inspector or Inspectors of the several Warehouses, shall, and are hereby obliged and required, on the first Day of every *August* Court, during the continuance of this Act, to return to the said Court a distinct and fair List of the Marks, Numbers, Tare, and Nett Branded Weights of every Hoghead of Tobacco, then in their several Warehouses respectively, that have been Inspected above Three Years, to be lodged with the Clerk of the County; and the Justices are hereby required to cause a Copy of the said List to be immediately set up at the Court-House Door, advertising the Tobacco therein mentioned, to be Sold on the third Day of the said Court, if fair Weather, and if not, the next fair Day, and shall cause the same to be sold at the Time aforesaid, at Public Vendue, in single Hogsheds, and the Produce thereof shall be applied to the defraying the County Charge. And whenever thereafter the Owner or Owners of such Tobacco, shall claim the same, or any Part thereof, and make his, her, or their Property appear, to the satisfaction of the said Justices, then the said Justices shall assess, in the next County Levy, such Sum as such Tobacco Sold for, for the Use of the said Owner or Owners.

Proviso, as to Owners of old Tobacco claiming, &c.

CLI. **Provided always**, That if any Owner or Owners of any Hoghead or Hogsheds of Tobacco, which shall be returned in such List, shall, within Two Months next before the said Court of Sale, give Notice in Writing to the Inspector or Inspectors of the Warehouse in which such Tobacco lies, of their being Owner or Owners thereof, describing in the said Notice the Mark, Number and Nett Weight of such Tobacco, and that they are unwilling the same should be Sold, such Notice or Notices shall be by the said Inspector or Inspectors, returned and lodged with the said List, and such Tobacco shall be marked, *Not to be Sold*, in the Copy before directed to be set up, nor shall the same be sold; any thing herein before contained to the contrary notwithstanding.

Old Tobacco Listed not a good Tender.

CLII. **And provided also**, That no old Tobacco Listed as aforesaid, shall after it is so Listed, be deemed, taken, or allowed to be a legal Tender in any Tobacco Payment whatever, any thing herein contained to the contrary notwithstanding.

Duration.

CLIII. This Act to continue until the first Day of *December* which shall be in the Year of our Lord, One Thousand Seven Hundred and Sixty-six, and no longer.

C H A P. II.

Passed 31st of *October*.

An Act for the Adjournment of Baltimore County Court. OBS.

The Preamble to this short ACT, sets forth, That some of the Attorneys Practising in the said Court, being Members of the Assembly, were obliged to attend their Duty therein; Therefore the said Court, which was to meet on the first Tuesday of *November*, is hereby Adjourned to the last Tuesday of the same Month. And as the End and Design of the Act, is, (before the Publication of it could possibly be, with the other Laws of the Session,) fully answered and completed, and become *Obsolete*, the inserting it here can answer no Purpose whatever.
