By the Excellency the Governor having, by his proclamation, called on the General Assembly of the State of Maryland to meet on Tuesday the seventeenth day of October the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and eighty, in consequence whereof the following members appeared on that day.

The adjournment was continued from day to day until

THURSDAY, November 2, 1780.

At the meeting of the Senate, the honorable Daniel of St. Thomas Jenifer, Esq; president, Matthew Tilghman, Esq; Charles Carroll, of Carrollton, Esq; Brice T. B. Worthington, Esq; William Madison, Esq; William Hambley, Esq; and Upton Phillips and DeLoach, from the house of delegates, deliver to the president the following message:

THE HOUSE OF DELEGATES, NOVEMBER 2, 1780.

Resolved, that the House of Delegates have appointed from nine o'clock in the morning until one in the afternoon, the 2d day of November, for the dispatch of business.

By the Senate, from the house of delegates, deliver to the president a bill, entitled "An act for the adjournment of several county courts within this State, endorsed; "By special order, November 2, 1780: Read the first and second times by special order
