

T H U R S D A Y, January 5, 1804.

THE senate met. Present the same members as on yesterday. The proceedings of yesterday were read. The bill, entitled, An act to incorporate companies to make several turnpike roads through Baltimore county, and for other purposes, the bill, entitled, An act to confirm the partition made by certain commissioners therein mentioned, and for other purposes, the bill, entitled, An act to authorise the opening of a road in Anne-Arundel and Prince-George's county, the bill, entitled, An act empowering the chancellor to direct a sale of the real estate of Richard Jacob Duckett, late of Prince-George's county, deceased, for the purposes therein mentioned, and the resolution respecting property in the town of Oxford, were sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

The resolution in favour of the securities of Robert Sinclair was read the second time, assented to with the proposed amendment, and sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

Amendment proposed. Strike out the word "November" in the 2d line of the 1st resolution and insert "May."

The resolution directing Lawrence Brengle to pay to the trustees of Frederick county school a certain sum of money, was read the second time, dissented from, and sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

Mr. Nelson, from the committee, delivers to the president a bill, entitled, An act authorising a lottery to raise a sum of money for opening and clearing the road to be opened from Westminster, in Frederick county, to George-town and the city of Washington; which was read the first and second time by especial order and passed.

The resolution in favour of the trustee of the state of Maryland was read the second time, assented to, and sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

The resolution in favour of Thomas Jackson, of Dorchester county, was read the second time, assented to, and sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

The resolution in favour of Joseph Ennalls was read the second time and dissented from.

The clerk of the house of delegates delivers a bill, entitled, An act empowering the chancellor to direct a sale of the real estate of Priscilla Howerton, late of Prince-George's county, deceased, for the purpose therein mentioned, a bill, entitled, An act extending the time for taking the bond of the sheriff of Montgomery county, severally passed by that house January 3, 1804; a bill, entitled, A further supplement to the act, entitled, An act to erect Baltimore-town, in Baltimore county, into a city, and to incorporate the inhabitants thereof, a bill, entitled, An act annulling the marriage of Joseph Bray, of Anne-Arundel county, and Anne his wife, a bill, entitled, An act to revive and continue an act to enable John S. Belt, James Walker and Archibald Dorsey, to complete the collection of the county tax in certain districts in Anne-Arundel county, a bill, entitled, An act to authorise the levy court of Baltimore county to establish two additional warehouses in the city of Baltimore for the inspection of tobacco, severally passed by that house January 5, 1804; which were severally read the first time and ordered to lie on the table.

Also the bill, entitled, An act for the relief of Richard Morgan, of Montgomery county, and Christopher Woolford, of Washington county, and the bill, entitled, An act to aid the defect of the deed therein mentioned. Ordered to be engrossed.

The bill, entitled, An act for the relief of sundry insolvent debtors, was read the second time and passed with the proposed amendments.

Amendments proposed. 1. Strike out the word "John" in the interlineation between the 1st and 2d lines of the 2d page and insert "Jean." 2. After the word "McComas" in the 4th line of the 2d page insert "Winstone Smith." 3. Strike out "Anthony Lamerlere" in the 7th line of the same page. 4. Strike out "Fordon Pease" in the 10th line of the same page. 5. After the word "security" in the 6th line from the bottom of the 10th page insert the words "within two years." 6. At the bottom of the 17th page insert, "And be it enacted, that each insolvent debtor shall pay to the register of the court of chancery the sum of five dollars, to be paid to the chancellor."

The senate adjourns until to-morrow morning 9 o'clock.

The bill, entitled, An act authorising a lottery to raise a sum of money for opening and clearing the road to be opened from Westminster, in Frederick county, to George-town and the city of Washington, and the resolution in favour of Joseph Ennalls, were sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

The resolution in favour of Thomas Beall, of Samuel, was read the second time, assented to with the proposed amendment, and sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

Amendment proposed. At the end of the resolution add, "and provided also, that before the patent shall be sue on said certificate the said Thomas Beall, of Samuel, shall oblige himself, in such manner as the chancellor shall prescribe, to convey to the respective persons who have made the said improvements, or to those who claim under them, and their heirs, the several and respective pieces or parcels of land which are now held and possessed by them respectively, together with the improvements thereon, clear of all expences."
