THE senate met. Present the same members as on yesterday. The proceedings of yesterday were read. Mr. Thomas Johnson has leave of absence for a few days.

The bill, entitled, An act to incorporate the Union insurance company of Maryland, was read the second time and will pass. Sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

The clerk of the house of delegates delivers a bill, entitled; An act extending the time for taking the bond of the sheriff of Anne-Arundel county, passed by that house December 29, 1804, and the following resolutions:

BY THE HOUSE OF DELEGATES, DECEMBER 29, 1804.

RESOLVED, That all proceedings against William Gardiner, and others, for the recovery of the balance due by him to the state of Maryland, be and they are hereby suspended until after the first day of December, eighteen hundred and five, and that the said William Gardiner be and he is hereby indulged in the payment of the said balance till the period before mentioned; provided, that the judgment aforesaid shall continue and be in full force, notwithstanding the suspension of proceedings directed by this resolution, and if the balance that will then be due on the aforesaid judgment be not paid by the time aforesaid, an execution may again be issued against the said William Gardiner to enforce the payment thereof.

BY THE HOUSE OF DELEGATES, DECEMBER 29, 1804.

RESOLVED, That all proceedings against Charles Gardiner, and others, for the recovery of the balance due by him to the state of Maryland, be and they are hereby suspended until after the first day of December next, and that the said Charles Gardiner be and he is hereby indulged in the payment of the balance till the period before mentioned; provided that the judgment aforesaid shall continue and be in full force, notwithstanding the suspension of proceedings directed by this resolution, and if the balance that will then be due on the aforesaid judgment be not paid by the time aforesaid, an execution may again be issued against the said Charles Gardiner to enforce the payment thereof.

Which were severally read the first time and ordered to lie on the table.

The bill, entitled, An act extending the time for taking the bond of the sheriff of Anne-Arundel county, was read the second time and will pass with the proposed amendments. Sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

Amendments proposed. 1. Strike out the words "elect for" in the last line but one of the preamble and insert "of." 2. After the word "on" in the last line of the bill insert "the thirty-first day of December, eighteen hundred and four," and strike out the residue of the bill from the word "or" inclusive in the same line.

The bill, entitled, A further additional supplement to an act, entitled, An act to erect a town in Queen Anne's county, was read the second time and will pass with the proposed amendment. Sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

Amendment proposed. After the word "privileges" in the 2d line of the 2d page insert "and be subject to the same rules and regulation."

The senate resumed the consideration of the bill, entitled, An act to incorporate companies to make several turnpike roads through Baltimore county, and for other purposes, and after sometime spent therein, the question was put, Shall this bill pass as amended? Resolved in the affirmative, and sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

Amendments proposed. 1. After the word "to" in the 4th line of the 1st enacting clause insert "and through." 2. After the word "town" in the 9th line of the 1st enacting clause insert "and through Westminster to the Pennsylvania line towards Petersburg, as shall be agreed upon by a majority of the stockholders." 3. After the word "grain" in the 8th line of the 11th enacting clause insert "or crop." 4. Strike out the words "the said recited" in the 5th line 22d page and insert "this." 5. After the word "allowable" in the 7th line same page insert "it shall be lawful." 6. After the word "carriage" in the 3d line 23d page insert "if the excess of burthen shall be three hundred weight or upwards." 7. After the word "made" in the 15th line 25th page insert "and certified." 8. At the end of the 32d enacting clause add "And be it enacted That no toll-gate shall be erected within the distance of one mile from any of the towns or villages in this act mentioned."

The bill, entitled, An act to alter the time of holding the county court in Worcester county, was sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

The clerk of the house of delegates delivers the following resolution:

BY THE HOUSE OF DELEGATES, DECEMBER 28, 1804.

Whereas at the sale of the Choptank Indian lands in Dorchester county, made by the state agent in or about the month of August, seventeen hundred and ninety-nine, doct^r James B. Sullivane, of the said county, became the purchaser of two parcels thereof, denominated lots No. 14 and 15, and gave bond to the state for the same, which said lots had never been laid down by actual survey, marked and bounded, by the commissioners in the manner directed by the act of assembly in that case made and provided: And whereas it appears at the time of the sale the agent agreed and promised that the said lots should be surveyed, and the quantity of land contained therein ascertained at the expence of the state, but before this was done suits were commenced against
