

The clerk of the house of delegates delivers a bill, entitled, An additional supplement to an act to amend and amend the public roads in Harford county, and to repeal the third section of the act of assembly therein mentioned, a bill, entitled, An act to empower the levy court of Dorchester county to appoint a constable the village of New-Market in the said county, a bill, entitled, An act incorporating the justices of the peace court in the respective counties in this state for the purposes therein mentioned, a bill, entitled, An act to incorporate a town in Talbot county by the name of Saint-Michael's, and to appoint commissioners, severally passed by that house January 8, 1805; which were severally read the first time and ordered to lie on the table. And the bill, entitled, An act to enlarge further the powers of the trustees of the poor in the several counties therein mentioned, passed by that house January 7, 1805: Ordered that the said bill be engrossed. And also the bill, entitled, An act to incorporate a company to make a turnpike road to lead from the city of Baltimore near Richard Caton's limekiln, in Baltimore county, nearly in the direction of Jones's Falls to the city of Baltimore, with sundry amendments thereto, passed by that house January 7, 1805; which amendments were read.

The bill, entitled, An act for the support of Jacob Parell, of Frederick county, and the bill, entitled, An act to authorise and empower the levy court of Anne-Arundel county to assess and levy a sum of money for the purpose therein mentioned, were severally read the second time and will not pass. Sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

On motion, ORDERED, That the bill, entitled, An act for introducing a copious supply of wholesome water into the city of Baltimore, be committed for amendment.

ORDERED, That Mr. Houston, Mr. Ringgold and Mr. T. Johnson, be the said committee.

The bill, entitled, An act to release unto James Mosher the right of the state of Maryland in and to a lot of parcel of ground therein mentioned, was read the second time by especial order, passed, and sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

The bill, entitled, An act authorising the levy courts of Kent and Queen-Anne's counties to levy a sum of money for building a bridge over Chester river, at the Head of Chester, was sent to the house of delegates by the clerk.

Mr. Ringgold, from the committee, delivers a bill, entitled, A supplement to the act, entitled, An act in favour of the president and directors of the Patowmack company, and the commissioners of the federal buildings; which was read the first time and ordered to lie on the table.

Mr. Shriver has leave of absence for the remainder of the session.

On motion, Leave given to bring in a bill, entitled, A further supplement to an act, entitled, An act relating to negroes, and to repeal the acts of assembly therein mentioned. ORDERED, That Mr. Partridge, Mr. Houston and Mr. Christie, be a committee to prepare and bring in the same.

The president laid before the senate a letter from the executive, enclosing a letter from the treasurer of the western shore, stating that he had received a warrant from the government of the United States on the order of discount and deposite at Baltimore, for an instalment of forty thousand dollars, and the interest, due on the loans to the commissioners of the city of Washington on the first instant; which were read, and referred to the consideration of the house of delegates.
