On motion by Mr. Bayly leave given to bring in a bill entitled, a supplement to the act entitled, An act to incorporate a company for the purpose of cutting and making a canal between the river Delaware and the Chesapeake Bay. *Ordered*, That Messrs. Bayly, Evans, Hogg, Potter and Wilson be a committee to prepare and bring in the same.

On motion by Mr. T. N. Williams, leave given to bring in a bill entitled, An act authorising Lewis Derickson, late sheriff and collector of Worcester county to complete his collection. *Ordered*, That Messrs. T. N. Williams, Handy and Wilson be a committee to prepare and bring in the same.

Mr. Bayly from the committee delivers the following report:

THE Committee to whom was referred the petition of Elijah Langford, beg leave to report, that they have had the same in consideration, and find the facts therein stated to be true; they therefore submit the following resolution:

*Resolved*, That the treasurer of the western shore be, and he is hereby authorised and directed, to pay unto Elijah Langford of Somerset county, a revolutionary soldier, in quarterly payments, a sum of money equal to the half pay of a private, during the remainder of his life, as a remuneration for his meritorious services.

The clerk of the senate delivers the resolution making an appropriation for repairing and furnishing the government house, endorsed, "assented to;" the bill entitled, a supplement to the act entitled, An act to confirm a road in Harford and Baltimore counties therein mentioned; the bill to lay out, open and amend a road in Cecil county; the bill entitled, a supplement to an act entitled, An act to lay out and make a public road in Baltimore county, passed the twentieth of January eighteen hundred and eight; the bill entitled a further additional supplement to an act entitled, An act for opening a certain road in Baltimore county therein mentioned; the bill entitled, An act to revive an act entitled, An act to incorporate a company to make a turnpike road from Westminster to Hagers-Town; the bill making public a road in Harford county, and vacating the roads therein mentioned; and the bill to establish a public road in Prince George's county, severally endorsed, "will pass." *Ordered*, That the bill for the relief of Dennis M. Burgess of Prince George's county, endorsed, "will not pass;" and the bill to lay out and open a road in Cecil county, endorsed, "will pass;" the proposed amendment;" which amendment was read, assented to and the bill ordered to be engrossed.

Mr. T. N. Williams delivers a bill entitled, a further supplement to an act passed at November session seventeen hundred and ninety-six, entitled, "An act relating to negroes, and to repeal the act of Assembly therein mentioned;" which was read.
