The house proceeded to the second reading of the bill entitled, an act for laying an additional tax on property within the city and precinct of Baltimore.

On motion by Mr. Crabb the question was put, that the following be inserted as an addition to the preamble of said bill, viz : " And whereas, the committee to whom was referred the petition of Alexander Contee Hanson and Jacob Wagner, have reported, that they conceive the petitioners entitled to indemnity from the community which inflicted, or permitted those injuries to be inflicted."—*Therefore,*

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, that the governor be, and he is hereby required to appoint three capable and discreet persons, not residents of the city of Baltimore, to ascertain the damages sustained by Alexander Contee Hanson and Jacob Wagner, by the destruction of their property in Baltimore by a mob, in the months of June & July last, & the damages so ascertained, shall be levied by the levy court of Baltimore county, on the assessable property of Baltimore city, and paid to the said Alexander C. Hanson and Jacob Wagner.
