

- 2d. Insert the word "either" after the word "of" in the tenth line of the first page.  
 3d. Insert the words "or Harford" after the word "Baltimore" in the same line and page.  
 4th. Insert the words "or Harford" after the word "Baltimore" in the fourth line of the second page.  
 5th. Insert the words "respectively as the case may be" after the word "county" in the fourth line of the second page.
