On motion, the question was put, That the bill, entitled, An act to repeal the act of assembly therein mentioned, be read a second time by special order? Determined in the negative

On motion the bill, entitled, An act to incorporate the Reformed and Evangelical Lutheran Church in the county of Frederick, called St. Mary's Church, and to supply a defect in a deed made to the same, was committed to Messrs. Carmichael, Magruder and Hollyday.

THURSDAY, December 16, 1819.

The senate met. Present the same members as on yesterday, except Mr. Emerson. The proceedings of yesterday were read.

The bill, entitled, An act for the relief of the securities of William S. Handy, late collector and sheriff of Somerset county, and the resolution relative to the inspection of the arms at Easton, were sent to the house of delegates.

The bill, entitled, An act to repeal the act of assembly therein mentioned, was read the second time by special order, and on motion, the title was amended by substituting the following: An act to repeal the act of assembly, entitled, An act authorising the connecting of Water street with King George street at Jones's Falls, in the city of Baltimore, and the bill ordered to be engrossed for a third reading.

The bill, entitled, An act for the relief of Nelly Seegar, of Queen Anne's county; and the bill, entitled, An act to empower the county court of Queen Anne's county to divide the real estate therein mentioned, were read the second, and by special order the third time, passed, and sent to the house of delegates.

The bill, entitled, An act to repeal the act of assembly, entitled, An act authorising the connecting of Water-street with King George street, at Jones's Falls in the city of Baltimore, was read the third time by special order, passed, and sent to the house of delegates.

The clerk of the house of delegates delivers the following bills: A bill, entitled, An act for the benefit of the Washington Monument; a bill, entitled, A Supplement to an act for the better protection of slave holders in the several counties therein mentioned; and a bill, entitled, An act to incorporate the Mechanical Benevolent Society of Chester Town, in Maryland; which were read the first time and ordered to lie on the table.

The bill, entitled, An act for the benefit of Robert Boone, of Virginia, was read the third time and will pass with the proposed amendment:

Amendment proposed. After the word "removed" at the end of the bill add the following: that the said negro shall not be sold to any person residing out of the state, or for the purpose of being removed therefrom, until the expiration of three years after she shall be brought into this state.

The bill, entitled, A Supplement to the act, entitled, An act to appoint trustees for the sale of the property therein mentioned, being part of the real estate of the late Henry Willis, deceased, was read the second, and by special order the third time, and will pass.

The bill, entitled, An act for the relief of James Stewart and Martin Rockefield, of Washington county, and William Denning of the city of Baltimore, was read the second and third time by special order and postponed for further consideration.

The bill, entitled, An act to repeal certain acts therein mentioned, was read the second and third time by special order and will pass with the proposed amendment:

Amendment proposed. Before the word "Worcester" insert "St. Mary's."

The bill, entitled, An act for the benefit of the Washington Monument, was read the second time by special order, and on motion, Ordered, that the said bill have a third reading on Wednesday the 22d instant.

The senate adjourns until to-morrow morning 10 o'clock.

FRIDAY, December 17, 1819.

The senate met. Present the same members as on yesterday, except Mr. Winder. The proceedings of yesterday were read.

The supplement to the act, entitled, An act to appoint trustees for the sale of the real estate of the late Henry Willis, deceased; the bill for the benefit of Robert Boone, of Virginia, and the bill to repeal certain acts therein mentioned, were sent to the house of delegates.
