Also a bill, entitled, A further supplement to the act, entitled, An act for the distribution of a certain fund for the purpose of establishing free schools in the several counties therein mentioned; a bill, entitled, An act for the benefit of John M. Tavish; and a bill, entitled, An act to establish a patrol in Saint-Mary's, Prince-George's, Somerset and Charles counties; which were read the first time and laid on the table. And returns the bill to provide for the support and maintenance of debtors actually confined in prison, and the bill for the relief of Littleton Dennis Teackle of Somerset county, endorsed "will pass." Ordered to be engrossed. Also the bill relative to habitual drunkards, endorsed "will not pass."

The bill authorising the recording of a deed from Thomas Mulliken and wife, to William Berry, was read the second, and by special order the third time, and will not pass.

The amendments to the bill to amend and reduce into one system the laws to direct descents, were read the third time, assented to, and the bill ordered to be engrossed.

The further additional supplement to the act, entitled, An act to reduce into one the several acts of assembly respecting elections, and to regulate said elections, was read the third time by special order and will pass.

On motion of Mr. Maxcy, Leave given to bring in a bill, entitled, An act for the benefit of John Mercer. Ordered, That Messrs. Maxcy, Hughlett and Cresap, bring in the same.

The bill for the benefit of John M. Tavish, was read the second and third time by special order and will pass.

The further additional supplementary act, to the act, entitled, An act for quieting possessions, enrolling conveyances, and securing the estates of purchasers, was read the second, and by special order the third time, and will pass with the proposed amendment. Amendment proposed. Strike out from the word "state" 7th line to the end of that line.

The bill incorporating into one the several acts relating to constables fees, was read the third time and will pass with the proposed amendments.

Amendments proposed. 1. In 8th line 1st clause strike out "2 1-3." 2. In 15th line same clause strike out "13 1-3" and insert "2 1 2." 3. In 10th line same clause strike out "13 1-3" and insert "12 1 2." 4. Strike out in 17th line "16 1-2 and insert "12 1-2" 5. Strike out 18, 19, 20 and 21st lines. 6. In 1st line 2d clause after the word "execution" insert the word "or" 7. In 1st and 2d lines same sec. strike out the words "or distress for rent." 8. At the end of the bill add "to be recovered in the county court of the county where the offence shall be committed, or in the city court of Baltimore, if in the city of Baltimore, by bill of indictment."
