

The consideration of the bill for the benefit of Ebenezer T. Massey and Emily Ann his wife, was postponed until Monday the twenty first inst.

The senate resumed the consideration of the amendments proposed by the house of delegates, to the bill providing for the appointment of an Attorney General; which were read a second time and on motion made the order of the day for Monday 21st inst.

The bill to lay out a road in Baltimore county, was read a second time and laid on the table.

The bill for the re-valuation of real and personal property in Cecil county was read a second time and laid on the table.

The bill for the improvement of the navigation of the river Susquehannah, was read a second time and referred to Messrs. Bowie, M'Kim, Miller, Johnson and Dickinson.

The bill for the relief Thomas Henry and his wife of Montgomery county, was read a second time and laid on the table.

The bill authorising the Levy court of Washington county, to appoint commissioners to divide said county into seven election districts, and for other purposes, was read a second time and laid on the table.

The supplement to the act for the improvement of the public roads in Kent county, was read a second time and laid on the table.

The bill for the relief of David Imbrie of the city of Baltimore, was read a second time and referred to Messrs Wootton, Miller, Brownley, Chambers and Bowie.

The clerk of the house of delegates delivers a resolution in favor of Abraham Ross; a bill for the benefit of Henry Truit of Worcester county; a bill for the benefit of George and Wm Reed of Caroline county; a bill to regulate the pay of the justices of the orphans' courts for the several counties therein mentioned; a bill to authorise and empower the Levy court of Anne Arundel county, to assess and levy a sum of money for the purposes therein mentioned; a bill entitled, A further additional supplement to the act entitled, An act for the erection of a new Market house in Hager's town, Washington county, and for other purposes; a bill entitled, A supplement to the act entitled, An act for the benefit of the trustees of Garrison Forrest academy, and the Franklin academy in Baltimore county, and a bill for the relief of the heirs and widow of John Vincent Cooksey of Charles county, which were severally read the first time and laid on the table.

The senate resumed the consideration of the bill entitled, A further supplement to the act regulating the inspection of Tobacco, being the order of the day, and on motion the question was put, will the senate refer the bill to the consideration of the next general assembly? Determined in the negative; and on motion the further consideration of the bill was postponed until Thursday next.

The additional rule submitted by Mr. Johnson on Saturday, was read a second and by special order a third time and adopted.

The clerk of the house of delegates delivers a bill to make valid a deed therein mentioned; a bill for the benefit of Elijah Melson of Worcester county; a bill for the benefit of John Jamison, executor of Leonard Jamison; a bill to make public two roads in Baltimore county; a bill for the benefit of Robert Guest of Charles county, and a bill to lay out ground for a wharf and lumber yard, on Stableford's creek, in Dorchester county, which were severally read the first time, and laid on the table, and returns a bill to authorise the establishment of an additional ware house in the city of Baltimore for the inspection of Tobacco, endorsed "will pass with the proposed amendments;" which amendments were read the first and by special order the second and third time, and assented to, and the bill ordered to be engrossed.

On motion, Leave given to bring in a bill entitled, An act to regulate the removal of certain civil cases from one county to another. ORDERED, that Messrs Price, Wootton and Miller, bring in the same.

The bill for the benefit of John Jamison, executor of Leonard Jamison, was read by special order a second time, and the question was put will the senate strike out the words "of age," in the 8th line of the 1st section. Determined in the affirmative, and the bill was read a third time by special order, passed and sent to the house of delegates.

The bill to lay out and make public two roads in Cecil county; the bill to alter a certain road in Harford county; the bill authorising commissioners to make alterations in the election districts in Montgomery county, were sent to the house of delegates.

The Senate adjourns until tomorrow morning 10 o'clock.

TUESDAY, JANUARY 15, 1822.

The senate met. Present the same members as on yesterday The proceedings of yesterday were read.

The bill for the relief of the infant children of Levin H. Campbell, late of Dorchester county, was read a third time, passed and sent to the house of delegates.

The bill entitled, A further supplement to the act entitled, An act for the distribution of a certain fund for the establishment of free schools in the several counties therein mentioned, was read a third time, passed and sent to the house of delegates.

Mr. Price from the committee reports a bill entitled, An act to regulate the removal of certain civil cases from one county to another; which was read the first time and laid on the table.

On motion the following resolution was submitted to the senate, read the first, and by special order a second and third time and assented to.

RESOLVED, That the treasurer of the western shore, be and he is hereby directed to inform this house, at as early a period as possible during its present session, the whole number of persons who have been since the termination of the Revolutionary war, and who now are on the Pension list of this state; on whose order each pension is paid, and whether any other proof is required that the per-
