

land, beg leave to report, That they have had the same under consideration, and are of opinion that the principle embraced in said bill is correct, and ought to receive the sanction of this legislature. The committee however think that this bill does not propose the most advantageous mode of accomplishing the object; and as the senate have no power to amend it, it being a money bill, they would recommend the adoption of the following message; which was read.

The following message was sent to the house of delegates:

BY THE SENATE, January 19, 1822.

*Gentlemen of the House of Delegates*—As we do not approve of all the details of the bill passed by your body, entitled, An act relating to the University of Maryland, and have no authority to amend the same, we would suggest the propriety of a committee of conference on this subject, and for that purpose nominate Messrs Price, Johnson, Dickinson, M'Kim, Brownley, Miller and Claude of this body, to meet such gentlemen as you may appoint to constitute such committee, with directions to report to their respective houses the result of their deliberations.

The bill authorizing the levy court of Washington county to appoint commissioners to divide said county into seven election districts and for other purposes, was read a third time, and will pass with the proposed amendments. Amendments proposed—1st. In the fifth line, first section, after the word "lay" strike out the word "out," and insert the word "off." 2d. In the sixth line, same section, after the word "districts," strike out the words "the election for those districts," and insert "and that the election for each of the said districts respectively." 3d. In the eleventh line, same section, after the words "number six," insert the word "and." 4th. In the thirteenth line, same section, after the word "lay," strike out the word "out," and insert the word "off." 5th. In the fourteenth line, same section, after the word "territory" strike out the words "embraced therein." 6th. In the nineteenth line, same section, after the word "land" strike out the word "out" and insert the word "off." 7th. In the first line, third section, strike out the word "duties," and insert the word "duty."—Sent to the house of delegates.

Mr. Price from the committee of conference to whom was referred the bill relating to the University of Maryland, reported that they had taken the same under their consideration, and agreed on a bill as a substitute for the same, to be reported in the house of delegates.

The senate adjourned until Monday morning 10 o'clock.

MONDAY, JANUARY 21, 1822.

The senate met. Present the same members as on yesterday, except Mr. Bowie. Mr. Chambers appeared in the senate. The proceedings of yesterday were read.

The further and additional supplement to the act regulating the inspection of tobacco, was read a third time, passed, and sent to the house of delegates.

The bill for the relief of Leonard Smith, of Frederick county, was read a third time, and will not pass, and was sent to the house of delegates.

The clerk of the house of delegates delivered the following message:

BY THE HOUSE OF DELEGATES, Jan. 19, 1822.

*Gentlemen of the Senate*—We have received your message proposing to appoint a committee to proceed to inspect the wing-dam on the Susquehanna. We concur with the views expressed therein. Also a bill relating to the University of Maryland, which was read the first time and laid on the table. Also a bill to confirm and make valid the acts and proceedings of John Rigby, as a justice of the peace for Queen Ann's county. A bill for the relief of Mary Debruler, of Frederick county; and a bill to enable the commissioners of the town of Havre-de-Grace, to hold a lot of ground, and the improvements therein mentioned; which were read the first time and laid on the table.

Mr. M'Kim presented the petition of sundry inhabitants of Harford, and Baltimore city and county, praying for an act to make a road from the city of Baltimore to the bridge over the Susquehanna at or near Port Deposit; which was read and referred to Messrs. M'Kim, Chambers, Miller, Brownley and Cockey.

The bill to incorporate a company to make a turnpike road from Boonsborough to Hager's-town and for the extension of the charters of the several banks in the city of Baltimore, and for other purposes, was read a third time and ordered to lie on the table.

The further supplement to the act to regulate elections, was read a third time and ordered to lie on the table.

The bill for the benefit of the heirs and widow of John Vincent Cooksey, was read a third time, and will pass with the proposed amendments. Amendments proposed—1st. In the fourth line of the preamble after the letter 'a' strike out the word 'widow' and insert 'wife.' 2d. In the first line, first section, after the word 'Maryland' strike out the whole of the bill, and insert 'That the orphans' court of Charles county shall have authority to appoint a trustee or trustees to take possession of all the estate, real, personal and mixed, of John Vincent Cooksey, and to apply the same to the support and maintenance of the now wife of the said Cooksey, and to the support, maintenance
