

Brownley from the committee reported said bill, and it was read the first and by special order a second and third time, passed and sent to the House of Delegates.

The bill for the relief of Jacob Shelborne, of Allegany county, was on motion of Mr. Chambers referred to Messrs. Chambers, Miller and Price.

Mr. Wootton asked leave to bring in a bill for the appointment of an Inspector of flour in the city of Baltimore, and the question was put, will the senate grant the leave as asked? Determined in the negative.

Mr. Johnson from the committee to whom was referred the resolution rescinding the resolution of 1817, reported the same without amendment, and the question was put, will the senate assent to the resolution? Determined in the affirmative.

Mr. Johnson substituted the following message:

BY THE SENATE, February 18, 1822.

Gentlemen of the House of Delegates—We return you the bill entitled, An act relating to justices of the peace in the city of Baltimore, with amendments to your amendments, and hope your honorable body will concur in the same.

Wich was read and adopted.

On motion of Mr. Johnson the senate resolved itself into a committee of the whole, Mr. McKim in the chair, on the bill from the house of delegates entitled, An act regulating the inspection of tobacco, and after some time the committee rose and reported the bill with the following amendments:—1st. In the second line, first section, strike out 'passage of this law,' and insert 'first day of March next.' 2d. In the third line, same section, strike out 'Saint Mary's and Charles counties.' 3d. Strike out the whole of the second section. 4th. In the third line, third section, after the word 'places' strike out the rest of the section. 5th. In the fourth line, fourth section, strike out the word 'five' and insert 'three.' 6th. Strike out the fifth section, and in lieu thereof insert the following:—'And be it enacted, that it shall be the duty of each and every inspector, when required so to do by the owner of any tobacco by him inspected, to confine the said samples so by him drawn, in one bundle, by tying them together with a strong tape run through the head of said sample, in such manner as may appear to him most likely to prevent the said bundle from separating. And it shall be the duty of the said inspectors to confine on the said sample so united together, a slip of pasteboard, and to seal the said tape and pasteboard with sealing wax, and to impress the said wax with the stamp hereinafter directed to be provided, so that the name of the inspection where the said tobacco shall be inspected, may be legible on the said wax; and it shall be the duty of the said inspector to write on the said pasteboard, the number of the hoghead from which the sample shall have been drawn, the name of the owner thereof, and the name of the said inspector.' 7th. In the third line, sixth section, strike out the word 'inspector' and insert 'inspection.' 8th. In the sixth line, sixth section, after the word 'inspector' insert 'or inspectors.' 9th. In the same line after the word 'him' insert 'or them.' 10th. In the seventh line, same section, strike out 'seals' and insert 'wax.' 11th. In the eighth line, same section, after the word 'aforesaid' strike out the rest of the section. 12th. Strike out the whole of the seventh, eighth and ninth sections. 13th. In the first line, thirteenth section, strike out from the word 'that' to the word 'located' in the third line. 14th. In the fourth line strike out the word 'such' and insert 'an.' 15th. In the same line, after the word 'inspection' insert 'warehouse.' 16th. In the sixth line, same section, after the word 'inspector' insert 'or inspectors.' 17th. In the eleventh line, same section, strike out the word 'thereof' and insert 'the said samples,' and strike out the word 'the' after the word 'for.' 18th. In the fifteenth line, same section, strike out the words 'so that the dealers thereof may have notice.' 19th. After the word 'city' in the last line, insert 'and county.' 20th. In the fourth line, fifteenth section, strike out the word 'out' after the word 'delivered.' 21st. In the thirteenth line strike out the word 'good.' 22d. In the seventeenth line, after the word 'time' insert the word 'being.' 23d. In the tenth line, same section, transpose the word 'aforesaid' so as to read 'the aforesaid last section.' 24th. In the eighteenth line after the word 'counties' insert 'or Baltimore city court.' 25th. Strike out after the word 'omissions' in the nineteenth line to the end of the section; which amendments were read the first, and by special order a second and third time, and assented to, and the bill being read as amended a third time, the question was put, Shall the bill pass? The yeas and nays being required, appeared as follow:

AFFIRMATIVE—Messrs. Stuart, (president) Brownley, Chambers, Cockey, Johnson, Kent, McKim, Miller, Orrell, Price, Wootton—11.

NEGATIVE—Messrs. Bowie, Claude and Dickinson—3. So it was determined in the affirmative.

Cromwell; a resolution in favor of William S. Handy's securities; a bill to provide a revenue for the support of the government of this state; a bill entitled, A further supplement to the act entitled, An act to regulate lotteries; a bill entitled, An act relating to the payment of pensions granted by this state; a bill entitled, A further and additional supplement to the act entitled, An act concerning crimes and punishments.

The senate adjourned until 7 o'clock, P. M.
