

of assembly therein mentioned. On motion, the question was put, will the senate strike out the word "five," in the 25th line, 1st section, and insert "fifteen." Determined in the affirmative. On motion, the question was put "will the senate strike out the first section of the bill?" Determined in the negative. The bill was then laid on the table.

Mr. Johnson from the committee, made a favorable report upon the resolution relative to the Colonization Society; which was read a second and third time, by special order, amended, assented to, and returned to the house of delegates.

Amendment proposed, viz.—

Add at the end of the resolution, "Resolved that the governor be requested to transmit a copy of the above resolution to each of our said senators and representatives."

Mr. Brownley from the committee, made a favorable report upon the additional supplement to the act to regulate the inspection of lumber; the bill was then read a second, and by special order, a third time, rejected, and returned to the house of delegates.

Mr. Quinton from the committee, made a favorable report upon the bill for draining a branch of the Red Lyon, called Trap hill branch, from the head thereof, to Trap hill bridge; the bill was then read a second, and by special order a third time, passed, and returned to the house of delegates.

The bill to confirm a deed of conveyance therein mentioned, was read a second time. On motion, the question was put, "Will the senate receive the following as an amendment?"

Add at the end of the bill, "Provided, that nothing in this act shall be construed to effect or in any way to impair any right of dower which any widow of any past rector of the aforesaid parish of Saint Michaels, or the wife of the present rector, may have in the lands conveyed by the said deed of conveyance, unless such widow or wife consents in writing thereto." Determined in the affirmative. The bill was then read a third time by special order, rejected, and returned to the house of delegates.

Mr. Bowie from the committee, made a favorable report upon the resolution in favor of John Templeman; the resolution was then read a second time, and laid on the table.

Mr. Johnson from the committee reported favorably upon the bill to authorise the guardian of Lambert Smith Norwood, to lease the real estate therein mentioned; the bill was then read a second, and by special order a third time, passed and returned to the house of delegates.

Mr. Claude from the committee, made a favorable report upon the bill to protect the breed of fish in the rivers and waters of Anne Arundel county; the bill was then ordered to lie on the table.
